Dear colleagues!

Globalization of the international political and economic relations formed new threats and challenges to the health care system and the security of sovereign states. Health is recognized as one of the strategic elements for achieving the internationally agreed Millennium Development Goals and the main factor that establishes a link between its social and economic components. New challenges that go beyond national boundaries require a global response in the health sector. Increasingly important become international negotiations on health issues that define new mechanisms and new skills of diplomacy in the field of health and health-related governance segments. Adaptation of effective strategic health governance methods, development of joint actions of the health sector, public and private sectors for the common interest are relevant and timely measures.

The new challenges and solutions to overcome them in the field of global health are reflected in the resolutions of the General Assembly of the UN "Global health and foreign policy", 2009. (A / RES / 63/33), in the study of the WHO Regional Office "Governance for health in the XXI century", 2011, Report of the Director General WHO "Global health and foreign policy", 2012. "WHO's role in global health leadership" 2013.

Initiatives in promotion of the global health governance, urged Member States to consider health issues in the development of their foreign policy strategies. Diplomacy in global health includes such negotiations platforms and centers of influence as the World Trade Organization, the World Economic Forum, and the General Assembly of the United Nations. World Health Organization still remains an important center for diplomacy in global health. WHO activities received a boost through the negotiation of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (2003), the International Health Regulations (2005) and the WHO Global Code of Practice on the international recruitment of health personnel (2010). WHO's special role in the prevention of non-communicable diseases and control is enshrined in the Political Declaration high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the Prevention and Control Act of (2011) and Global Action Plan for Non-communicable Diseases in the 2013-2020 biennium.

The existing situation underlines the need to build human capacity for global health diplomacy through educational process.

Institute for Innovative Educational Programs in Healthcare, Peoples Friendship University of Russia in cooperation with the Global Health Programme, the Graduate Institute (Geneva), supported by the World Health Organization, conducts the first educational program in the Russian Federation "Global health, diplomacy and non-communicable diseases" (29 March - 3 April 2015) for professionals from health and health-related sectors in order to create effective health management skills and negotiating solutions to the most pressing problems in the health sector at the global and national level.
